Respected Members of The Casper Country Club,

2022 was a groundbreaking year for the Club, quite literally. We completed the installation of a modern irrigation system that had been in the works for close to 30 years. We made drastic improvements to the parking lot and pro shop access. And, with the expansion of the snack bar, it has never been so cool to hang by the pool. These changes were possible because of the Capital Dues Vote in 2021, and, to top it off, thanks to the hard work by Board Members, Bob, Scott and the whole team, the projects came in *under* budget. Yes, you read that correctly. Exciting things are happening at the Casper Country Club and the Membership deserve the lion's share of credit.

The Board is continuing to plan out the future and address the wants and needs, both current and projected, of the Club. Specifically, the Board has been rolling out new pricing related to guest and tournament relations in an effort to meet the new demands of the market and ease the burden on our Membership. Increasing the Club's guest and tournament revenue without adding golf events remains a goal of the Board as a way to support the Dues of the Membership while not sacrificing Member experience as Member Experience is the number one goal of the Board. That being said, Jenn and her team in the Clubhouse continue to add Ballroom events available to corporations, non-profits and others as well to help subsidize the food and beverage bottom line.

A wise person once said, timing is everything. While we nailed the timing of the irrigation and parking lot, saving close to a million dollars over current costs, operating expenses have continued to rise as a result of COVID and the unprecedented spending and policies rolled out since. The last two years have been difficult to budget as it relates to the inflation of prices on consumer goods and services. As a result, the Board was forced to implement an increase in dues for 2022. This was done to accommodate the Cost-of-Living Adjustment as determined by Local, State, and Federal economic agencies per a rule created in 2014 to help the Club meet the demands of ever increasing operating expenses. For 2022, the Wyoming Cost of Living Increase ("WCOLI") was 10.1% over 2021's increase of over 7%. The Board believes that a 10% increase in dues is gratuitous and has decided to keep the increase more in line with last year in the 7% range. Unfortunately, that still means an increase of XXX to this year's dues and is summarized in the table below:

We understand the strain that many of you are feeling as a result of the increase in cost of living and the Board was very diligent in its discussions related to this. At the end of the debate, we felt that a modest dues increase was warranted and necessary over the other options. As a quick reminder, the revenue from the Capital Dues increase a few years ago cannot be used for operations (only for capital projects and servicing the debt therein) so the additional increase in prices for fertilizer, fuel, equipment, labor, goods sold, etc. must be made up with additional revenue sources.

The unprecedented inflation has forced the Club into leaning out in some places while still being ever conscious of the experience we are providing our Membership. In 2022, the Club took over ownership of the Pro-Shop, invested in on course hospitality and drastically improved the Snack and Pool Bar area. Each of these investments showed a positive return both directly and indirectly and provides a playbook of sorts for how to keep improving moving forward. The Board is excited about what is coming down the pipeline at the Casper Country Club and we will continue to strive to make the experience of being a Member at the Casper Country Club better. On the course, at the pool, in the Clubhouse and even the experience you are having from your home. We appreciate your continued support and look forward to 2023 being another launching point for success.
